

HOW TO PREPARE A WITNESS

### WITNESS FOR THE PROSECUTION, "DAMN YOU, DAMN YOU"!





Schedule a trial meeting for a party witness (or a video or phone conference with a nonparty witness).


Review the case, the testimony and the purpose of the testimony






Explain the attorney-client privilege (if applicable)

Explain the process: court reporter, direct, cross





Tell the truth:

"I don't know what you mean"

"Certainly not"


"Perhaps in Germany"

Stay in control:

Be polite and kind

(do not get defensive or angry)





#### Listen:

Ask for questions you do not understand to be repeated, do not jump the gun



Answer only what you know:

If you don't remember then do not try to answer the question, regardless of how the question may change;

"I do not recall"


Answer only what is asked: "I only write on blue stationary"





Read documents carefully:

Ask for question to be repeated before testifying (after reviewing and reading the document); don't just start talking about the document




Wait for instructions after objections:

When your counsel objects, wait for the judge to instruct you on whether to answer or not. Always ask for the question to be repeated

Your cross is not your clean-up:

Explaining testimony you believe harmed your case during cross is not the time. Your attorney will clean-up during your rebuttable.







### Dry Run:

Prepare direct questions and practice cross
